
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5D4N SOUTH SULAWESI: MAKASSAR & TORAJA HIGHLANDS



BEST TIME TO VISIT: Dry season from Apr to Oct. Avoid Hari Raya Puasa season as tourism services may be halted or expensive.

DAY 1: Makassar arrival (D)

4.55pm Air Asia arrival at **Makassar** (Ujung Pandang) airport. Transfer to hotel for check-in and then proceed for dinner. Overnight in Makassar.

DAY 2: Makassar – Toraja (B/L/D)

Transfer to **Toraja** land along the coastal area, passing by scenic Bugis villages, until **Pare Pare**. After lunch, transfer to the hinterland of south Sulawesi, enjoy the panoramic views changing en-route such as at **Puncak Lakawan** and **Salubarani**. Arrival in **Tanah Toraja**, land of the Toraja people. The Toraja are an ethnic group indigenous to a mountainous region of South Sulawesi. Most of the population is Christian, and others are Muslim or have local animist beliefs known as aluk ("the way"). Overnight in **Rantepao**.

DAY 3: Fullday Toraja Tour (B/L/D)



Visit **Lemo** - where the burial places are carved high up on the rock cliffs. There are rows of effigies of deceased on display next to them. Continue then to **Pasiliran** in Sangalla area - it is

a burial place for babies on the tree trunk. The last visit before lunch is **Suaya** the burial site for the nobles of Sangalla. There are effigies on a balcony carved on the cliff and preserved ancient sarcophagus nearby. Lunch at local restaurant. Afternoon visit **Londa** – the biggest burial places in the cave. There rows of **Tau Tau or wooden effigies** are displayed in the balcony. Proceed then to **Ke'te' Ke'su** one of the most beautiful places with rows of traditional houses set on a beautiful setting. Ke'te Ke'su area is well-known for **Toraja wood carving** too. Take the chance to walk to a burial place just behind the village. There are hanging ancient wooden sarcophagus and rows of wooden effigies also exist here. Overnight in Rantepao.

DAY 4: TORAJA – MAKASSAR (B/L/D)

After breakfast, transfer back to **Makassar** with a lunch stop en-route. Late afternoon arrival in Makassar, check in hotel and at leisure. Overnight in Makassar.

DAY 5: MAKASSAR - departure (B/L)



Visit Fort Rotterdam – the fort built by Makassar King but then taken over by Dutch after the seven year war. It is now a museum and cultural center. Proceed to Paotere harbour to view Bugis Schooner boats. Then some shopping time in the city. Transfer to the airport for Air Asia 5.40pm flight home.

RATES: per person, twin share basis, for **MALAYSIA Passport** holders only, according to group sizes below, valid for travel until 30 DEC 2015.

Not valid for festival period like Hari Raya or X'Mas (surcharges to be advised)

INCLUSIVE:
